2008 Measurement Year Methodology for Awards and Recognition

Top Overall Performing Organizations

Forty six (46) physician groups performed in the top 20% overall for Measurement Year 2008 and received recognition for outstanding overall performance. These groups were identified by calculating composite scores in each of the four P4P measurement domains, which are weighted according to the recommended P4P payment weightings: Clinical Quality - 55% (including 15% for Coordinated Diabetes Care clinical measures), Patient Experience - 25%, Coordinated Diabetes Care Registry - 5%, and IT-Enabled Systemness - 15%. An overall composite score for each participating physician group is calculated, and the 46 groups with the highest overall composite scores are designated as top overall performers.

$$\text{Overall Composite} = [\text{Clinical Composite} * 55\%] + [\text{Patient Experience Composite} * 25\%] + [\text{Coordinated Diabetes Care Registry Score}] + [\text{IT-Enabled Systemness Score}]$$

Ronald P. Bangasser, M.D., Memorial Award for Quality Improvement

The “most improved” award is presented to the physician group in each of the eight P4P regions that demonstrated the most overall improvement from the previous year. Overall composite scores for the current and previous years are used. The award winners are determined by calculating the relative improvement for each physician group on the overall composite score for this year compared to the overall composite score for last year. The physician group in each of the eight P4P regions that has the highest relative improvement score for overall performance is recognized as the most improved group in that region.

Relative Improvement =

$$\frac{\text{MY 2008 Overall Composite} - \text{MY 2007 Overall Composite}}{\text{Perfect Score} - \text{MY 2007 Overall Composite}}$$

The California counties within each of eight P4P regions are noted below:

Central Coast	Monterey, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, San Luis Obispo, and Ventura
Central Valley	San Joaquin down to Kern and all counties East
Inland Empire	San Bernardino and Riverside
Los Angeles	Los Angeles
Orange County	Orange
Sacramento	Napa, Sacramento, Sonoma, Solano, and all counties North
